General remarks:

Since 2005, UWCM has distributed 89 goats (86 she-goats and 3 he-goats). The first batch was distributed to families in various scattered communities/villages where UWCM has other interventions. Because of the constraints in follow up and monitoring the activity, members resolved to concentrate in one area with more goats given.

During the second batch goats were distributed in 3 communities each receiving 10 she-goats. More 20 goats were distributed in these 2 communities of Bugobero and Bulaago each receiving 10 more.

The 3 he-goats bought were distributed in the 3 communities of Bulaago, Bumasikeye and Busedani. They are all healthy and servicing the goats including the local ones in the area. Communities there contribute some small fee, which is used to maintain the he-goat. More he-goats will be bought in the next batch to be distributed to other communities, which do not have the Burks.

We are still monitoring the health of the recently distributed goats to the 20 families and a report will be given in the next quarter.

i. Statistics to date:

							-It is assumed that goats mostly die of fever and environmental changes. -Some families with elderly folk are not keen to de-worm the goats and also feeding. Some goats were still young and small thus took long to produce. However, we are grateful that farmers are gaining experience in management of the goat project after follow up and knowledge given.

ii. Achievements:

- Goats have multiplied.
- Burks in the community have improved quality of the local she-goats.

- There is pride of the family in owning a goat.
- Because children own goats they have learnt to co-operate with guardians. (sign of responsibility for children).
- Together with their families some children have sold kids to purchase scholastic materials + other family support e.g. Namutosi Janet (025/05) sold one kid to buy the scholastic materials and improve the goat shelter.
- Despite the challenges we have encouraged the families to let the goat project remain because once managed well yields quick returns.
- Most children own a goat project and benefit directly.

iii. Challenges:

- Many goats dying, aborting due to unknown out-breaks.
- Temptation by families to change the projects.
- Most goats are not producing enough milk for consumption.
- Inadequate funds for follow up activity and facilitation to volunteers
- Goats are a good supplement to children's education, however, many children stay home due to lack of fees payment by families.
- One of the beneficiaries – Nekesa Sharon (027/05) had sickle cells and passed away at the end of Jan. 2007. During the visit of the Pont team in Nov. 2006, they were able to see this family in Bumbobi community and had a meal together in their home. We covet your prayers for this family especially the grandmother and Sharon's mum. They say, *"We have been left with a kid in remembrance of little Sharon!"* Sorry.

iv. Recommendations:

- Facilitate the local technical staff to support the farmers in the community.
- Facilitate a particular staff in each organization to make a follow up of goat project.
